# Psycho-Social-Spiritual Care Coordinator 1-Permanent Part-Time (21hrs/wk)

Reporting To: Manager, Hospice Palliative Care and Volunteer and Student Placement Programs

### **Purpose:**

This position is responsible for developing, implementing, coordinating and supervising all activities of Psycho-Social-Spiritual Care Program. The Psycho-Social-Spiritual Care Coordinator will assess Individuals referred for psycho-social spiritual care, develop a care plan in partnership with the individual and act as the liaison between the individual, their volunteer and other care team members in ensuring the care plan is implemented. The Coordinator will provide the necessary information, support, debriefing and consultation to Volunteers to enable them to meet the needs of individuals accessing services.

### Key areas of responsibility:

#### **Program Development and Management:**

- Plan, implement, facilitate, supervise and evaluate spiritual care activities and events
- Develop and review policies and practice guidelines for program management and service delivery
- Develop & review spiritual care resource materials for program use
- Design support materials for distribution to individuals receiving The Psycho-Social-Spiritual Care services
- Identify and pursue opportunities for community partnerships toward developing service delivery initiatives
- Ensure that there are accurate records in the process of Referral, Assessment, Service Delivery,
  Discharge and Evaluation
- Coordinate with other established community programs that are involved in psycho-socialspiritual care
- Participate in Continuous Quality Improvement (CQI) initiatives by identifying areas for quality improvement related to psycho-social-spiritual care and by implementing changes where appropriate

## **Service Delivery**

 Collaborate with the Hospice Palliative Care Team on the provision of services and support to individuals accessing hospice services

### **Individual Support:**

- determine the appropriateness of all psycho-social-spiritual care referrals and redirect inappropriate referrals in a professional manner
- ensure that Individuals understand the supportive (non-clinical) role of the hospice psycho-socialspiritual care services
- develop and document care plan based on Individual identified issues; maintain confidential record with all contact and relevant details of care plan implementation
- organize psycho-social-spiritual care activities to meet Individual's needs
- communicate with the assigned volunteer and other members of the care team as needed
- serve as primary psycho-social-spiritual care provider or to facilitate access to spiritual care through the individual's own faith/cultural community

### **Education and Support**

- Develop/facilitate education programs/workshops for the general public and staff on spiritual distress and related topics.
- Assist with the coordination of the annual Hospice Palliative Care Memorial Service

#### Other

- Participate in staff/program meetings and committees
- Participate in Volunteer Appreciation events, staff orientation, and student placements as requested

## **Essential Qualifications (Knowledge, Experience):**

- Master's Degree in Divinity
- Minimum 5 years experience in hospice palliative care preferably in the community setting
- CASC Certification preferred
- Registered with CRPO required or willing to register within 3 months of employment

#### **Essential Competencies (Skills and Attributes):**

- Oral and/or written fluency in other languages would be considered an asset
- Proficiency in the use of computers and various software applications including EHR applications
- Demonstrated knowledge of health care system as it relates to palliative care delivery
- Demonstrated problem solving and critical thinking
- Demonstrated time management and ability to work autonomously
- Excellence in communication, partnership building and inter professional care commitment
- Demonstrated commitment to continuous learning and professional development
